# **Bundanoon Auxiliary Closes**

It is with great sadness that the Bundanoon Auxiliary Inc. has voted to voluntarily close as a formal group after serving the Bundanoon residential care home for over **15 years** and fundraised an estimated **\$90,000**.

During this time, the Auxiliary organised many popular events, including Mah-jong days, summer fairs, fashion parades, cake stalls, car boot sales, trivia nights, and meat raffles at the Bundanoon Club, among others.

All funds raised were used to purchase valuable items for residents, such as air chairs, diversional therapy supplies, air mattresses, iPads, syringe drivers, outdoor furniture, and garden enhancements, to name a few.

The Auxiliary met faithfully every month to plan and coordinate these events, always liaising with the Manager and lifestyle teams to ensure they could fund items that truly enriched the lives of the residents at Bundanoon.

On behalf of Warrigal and the Bundanoon care home, we thank, Janice Grimson, Jan Newbury, Ann McCarter, Juliet Robert, Vera Blain, Nola Flower, Wendy Johnston, Margaret Fitzpatrick, and Anne Derham, for your immense dedication and hard work over the years. # **Know Me Project Update**

#### What is the Know Me program?



The Know Me Program is a research project in partnership with Warrigal and the Australian National University running over a 16 week period. Volunteers were trained to learn about reminiscence and digital story making, and paired with a resident who had a diagnosis of dementia or some cognitive impairment.



"They had someone to listen to them and understand them. They had someone who had time to be with them. She knows she's slower than she used to be but still wants to be included. This program gave her someone that was available to go at her pace". (ST – Know Me Volunteer)

A total of 15 keen volunteers commenced at Warrigal Calwell, Queanbeyan, Stirling and Hughes in early July. These volunteers were predominantly local university students studying psychology and social work.

With the support of Warrigal staff at each home, the volunteers reported gaining invaluable insight into older people, aged care and dementia. They reported having developed a deeper appreciation that older people have lived full lives, just like themselves, and are worthy of respect and care.

"To me, it's knowing how meaningful this experience was. I met a real, human being. I made a difference, even if it's just 1%, in her life. If her life is even just a little bit brighter towards the end of her life, then my job is done. It is so rewarding knowing I got to share the gift of memory and reminiscence with her. especially considering she might not have been able to remember those all wonderful memories on her

Of the Warrigal residents who received a volunteer visitor to reminisce with them each week, staff commented that one resident is now joining in activities and meals and conversing with staff and other residents, and has shown improvements in mood and cognitive abilities.

Volunteers provided feedback that the residents really enjoyed reminiscence sessions and watching their digital stories.

More feedback will be sought by the researchers from residents, families and volunteers throughout November/December.

# **New Bus for Goulburn**


